Johnson posed a question to Griffin asking if Deltech has ever dealt with the board about the request. Griffin said he did not know all of the contacts Elefante had with Durant officials but that Elefante had spoken to Rob-

Griffin said he had conversations with Young and a representative from the state development authority about Durant's electrical supply not being reliable.

"Hunter Engineering and AmeriPride both have had difficulties with their supply," said Griffin.

Robinson said later that the city had issues with the electrical reliability in the past years but many of them were addressed through grant

Robinson said he felt that he and the board were left out of discussions on the matter and that Elefante was specifically told that Durant's electricity was unreli-

"We should have been invited to discuss this before that meeting at Durant Baptist, before these petitions started going around," said Robinson, "or saying we have to do it your way, this is not Burger King. We don't operate like that. I'm going to let everybody know, we have a select group of people called the 'street committee,' they always run back and tell something but they always miss some details, something they don't need to miss, and they sow seeds of discord. You have this side and that side when it should be all of us working together."

The matter was tabled by the board until the meeting with Elefante on Wednesday.
