infrastructure.

"We're applying through the state aide but using our current budget to repair bridges as quickly as we can," said Morrison. "Those that have been closed, most of them are now open, Howard Road bridge, and we're planning to fix some others with county money. We've got a list a mile long we're working on, including five new bridges in the county, using the money that the county has. We've got a lot more needs than we've got money."

Morrison said upcoming projects include repairing two bridges on old Wilson Road and starting repairs on two bridges, one near Riverdale Ranch and another one a mile away towards Bowling Green.

"All of these will be fixed with county monies," said Morrison. "I wish it was sooner, I wish it was quick-

With the Howard Road bridge being repaired with state aid money and no longer the worst bridge in the county, efforts are being focus on others.

"They are being repaired," Morrison continued, "the one on Howard Road and Holly Grove Meeks Road were repaired in place. The one on Wilson Road is being replaced with a box bridge. All of the pilings on the Howard Road bridge have been replaced, we did not replace the decking, there was really nothing wrong with it. I'd wish we would have had money to replacing the railing on it."
