The Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks (MDWFP) announces several proposed changes for deer and turkey seasons approved during the September 19, 2018 Commission held at MDWFP's Headquarters in Jackson.

Deer Season

- Importation of cervid carcasses from ANY state, regardless of CWD status is now prohibited.
