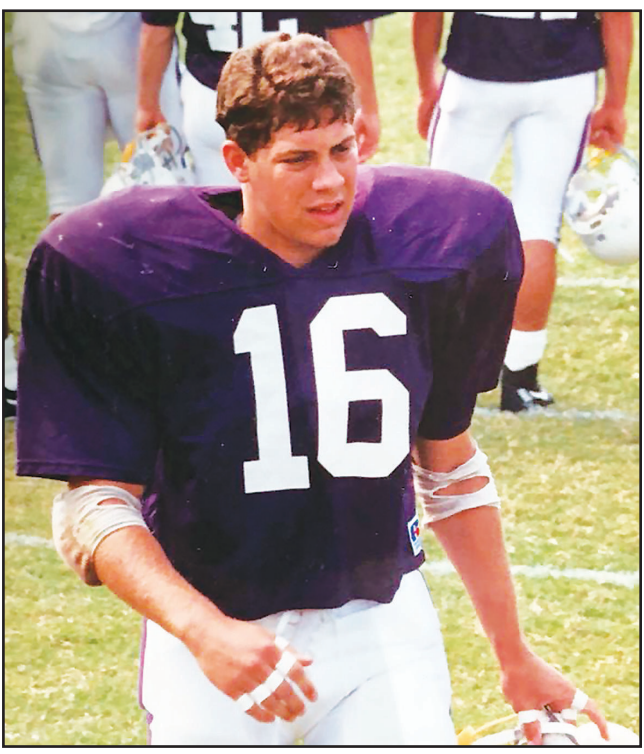

Chuck Edwards inducted into the Millsaps Sports Hall of Fame

 Chuck Edwards was inducted into the Millsaps' 2018 Sports Hall of Fame in football for the class of 1995. The induction ceremony was held on October 12, 2018 at the Jackson Country Club. On Saturday, the inductees were introduced at half time during the homecoming ceremonies of the Millsaps football game. Edwards is one of the most prolific tacklers and pass defenders in Millsaps College history. He finished his college career ranked third all-time in Millsaps history with 15 career interceptions. His 198 solo tackles and 318 total tackles are both still top-five all time in Majors' history.

Edwards earned First-Team ALL-SCAC (Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference) honors in 1993, 1994 and 1995. Edwards also served as team captain for the 1995 and 1996 seasons. Over his career, he was named SCAC player of the week five times. Chuck Edwards earned an MBA from Millsaps in 1996, and a law degree from the University of Mississippi in 2000. He began his private practice in 1999. He currently serves as the county prosecutor for Holmes County, Mississippi.

VA recognizes Vietnam Veteran with first Medal of Honor Medallion during ceremony at county cemetery

 The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) furnished the first Medal of Honor (MOH) Medallion for the private headstone of Pfc. Milton L. Olive III, a decorated Vietnam-era war hero, during a ceremony Nov. 1 at West Grove Cemetery in Lexington, Mississippi. With the passage of Public Law 114-315 on Dec. 16, 2016, Congress authorized VA's National Cemetery Administration (NCA) to issue, upon request, a medallion, headstone or marker signifying a Veteran as an MOH recipient who served on or after April 6, 1917, and is buried in a private cemetery.
