BUTTER PECAN POUND CAKE

1 box butter pecan cake mix 1 cup water 1 cup vegetable oil 4 eggs 1 (16 oz.) can caramel

pecan frosting Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a Bundt pan with Baker's Joy cooking spray and set aside. Combine all ingredients in a large mixing bowl. Beat with a handheld mixer until smooth. Pour batter into prepared pan and bake for 50 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean. Allow to cool in pan for 10 minutes and invert on a wire rack to cool completely.

1 ½ lbs. ground beef

1 (1 oz.) pkg. taco seasoning mix 1 (10 oz.) can Ro-Tel diced tomatoes 1 (lb.) pkg. Velveeta, cubed 1 (16 oz.) loaf party rye bread

In a large skillet, cook ground beef until no longer pink; drain fat. Add taco seasoning and undrained tomatoes to skillet; cook about 3 minutes and remove from heat. Add cheese and stir until melted. Spread mixture on top of rye bread slices and bake at 350 degrees for about 15 minutes.

4 cups pecan halves ½ stick butter 1 Tbsp. salt ½ tsp. white pepper Few drops Tabasco

Heat oven to 350 degrees and melt butter in a shallow, sided baking sheet. Add Tabasco to melted butter and mix. Add nuts and stir to coat. Bake approximately 20 minutes, stirring every 5 minutes. Mix salt and pepper and sprinkle on nuts after toasting. Let cool.
