Spring cleaning, cell towers, holiday change topics for aldermen

Several items were presented for discussion/action at the March 6 Clinton Board of Aldermen meeting. Hinds County Supervisor of District 4 Mike Morgan also was on hand to give a status report to the Mayor and Board.

Supervisor Morgan appeared at the bi-monthly meeting to report on road construction affecting Clinton residents on North Midway Road to Snake Creek and Airport Road. Funds from a \$40 million bond issue approved two years ago are being spent to improve a variety of roads in the county, which has a population of 250,000 with 800 miles of roads. Morgan indicated his desire to talk with the individual mayors and boards of aldermen in each municipality encompassed within District 4, which includes Jackson, Clinton, Raymond and Bolton. He said the Supervisors' priority "is to get the money spent," completing paving projects and "fixing bridges." He specifically said he wanted to work cont. on page 33

The city's newest green space, Town Spring Park, was recently dedicated in Olde Towne Clinton. It was built around an historic spring that served as the focal point of life in the early days of Clinton's development.

The feature was designed to be a quiet respite within the Olde Towne area for walkers, joggers, or those just strolling through the city's historic district.

Unlike recreational parks that feature play equipment or playing fields,

City releases list of street ratings for paving

City of Clinton officials recently released the list of streets that are anticipated to be paved in 2018.

Streets are graded by City engineering staff on a yearly basis. Street paving is completed based on the street ratings; roads with the lowest rating are given priority over higher graded streets. Officials say this approach maximizes paving dollars to address the most critical streets each year.

October 1, the city has budgeted \$1,000,000 for paving. Approximately elevent miles of streets will be paved in 2018. In 2017, the City paved/striped 3.75 miles of streets, for a total expenditure of \$400,000. In 2016, the City paved just under 3 miles of streets, for a total expenditure of \$300,000. Over the next four years, the paving budget will be increased \$100,000 per year to meet the paving demand for the city.
