Following an inspection by bridge engineers on Monday, March 12, the City of Clinton was informed that the North Midway Road bridge between

Clinton/Raymond Road and McRaven Road in Clinton has been closed to all traffic.

Bridge closed signs have been placed by Clinton Public Works to prevent use of the bridge by motorists.

Inspections were completed on the North Midway Road

Bridge in 2017, with weight limits posted and the bridge deemed sufficient for use. Following the most recent inspection, it was determined that the bridge was deficient, and the bridge would need to be closed for

immediate repairs.

Mayor Phil Fisher and City engineers are working on plans to receive bids on emergency repairs to provide a short-term solution. The short-term repair is expected to extend the life of

the bridge for up to five years and provide an opportunity for a long-term solution to be designed and funded.

According to Fisher, "while a permanent fix is our ultimate goal, our immediate desire is to make the repairs and get the bridge reopened to traf-

fic as quickly as possible for residents and guests traveling to Clinton."

"We regret the inconvenience this closure will have on our residents and visitors, but the safety of our motorists is the top priority," added Fisher.
