July 4th Extravaganza parking and traffic plans announced

Clinton Police have announced instructions for arriving, parking and departing Traceway Park for the 29th Annual Family Fireworks Extravaganza. Parking will open at 4 p.m. in parking lots accessible by Soccer Row. Once all spots are filled along Soccer Row, Cynthia Road from Arrow Drive to overflow parking next to Soccer Field 7 will be blocked to traffic.

Traceway's Baseball Alley will be open at 4 p.m. for those desiring to tailgate before the event in that section of the park.

Once the Soccer Row intersection with Cynthia Road has been closed, those arriving from Arrow Drive will be asked to make a left turn on Cynthia Road to turn around and proceed back down Arrow Drive to park at one of the schools along Arrow Drive. Ad-

ditional overflow parking will be available at the softball/baseball fields of Traceway Park for those arriving from Northside Drive.

No parking will be allowed on the shoulders of Northside Drive, Cynthia Road or Arrow Drive. Violations could result in ticketing or towing.

Parking in the Cascades subdivision will be restricted to residents and their guests. Parking on right of ways and common areas of Cascades could result in ticketing. Cascades homeowners will be provided four parking passes that will be good only on the Fourth of July. The entrance to Cascades will be limited to Cascades Circle West and Cascades Circle East and will be granted to those only with approved parking passes or valid identification verifying residency in Cascades. Waterfall Way and Twin Lakes North entrances


will be blocked and monitored by police.

Following the event, those exiting overflow parking on Cynthia Road and Baseball Alley will be directed toward Northside Drive. Those exiting Soccer Row will have the option of heading west on Arrow Drive or turning east (right) on Cynthia Road. No left turns onto Cynthia Road will be allowed from Soccer Row.

Parking for the event at all locations is \$10 per car, and the event itself is free. Parking at the schools along Arrow Drive will be managed by school groups and PTOs as a fundraiser for the schools.

Event gates will open at 4 p.m., with introductions and entertainment set to begin at 5 p.m. Attendees are encouraged to bring a tent and chairs to enjoy the celebration.
