Angels are available for pick-up at Funtime Preschool, Holy Ghost Baptist Church, Parkway Pharmacy, Northside Baptist Church, CrossFit Chi-Rho, the YMCA and the Baptist Healthplex. Items collected for each angel should be returned to the location from which the angel was originally placed, with the exception of bicycles, which may be taken to the 4 C's.

to go to college, but he has time to decide. He's considering a career in computer science or a related


