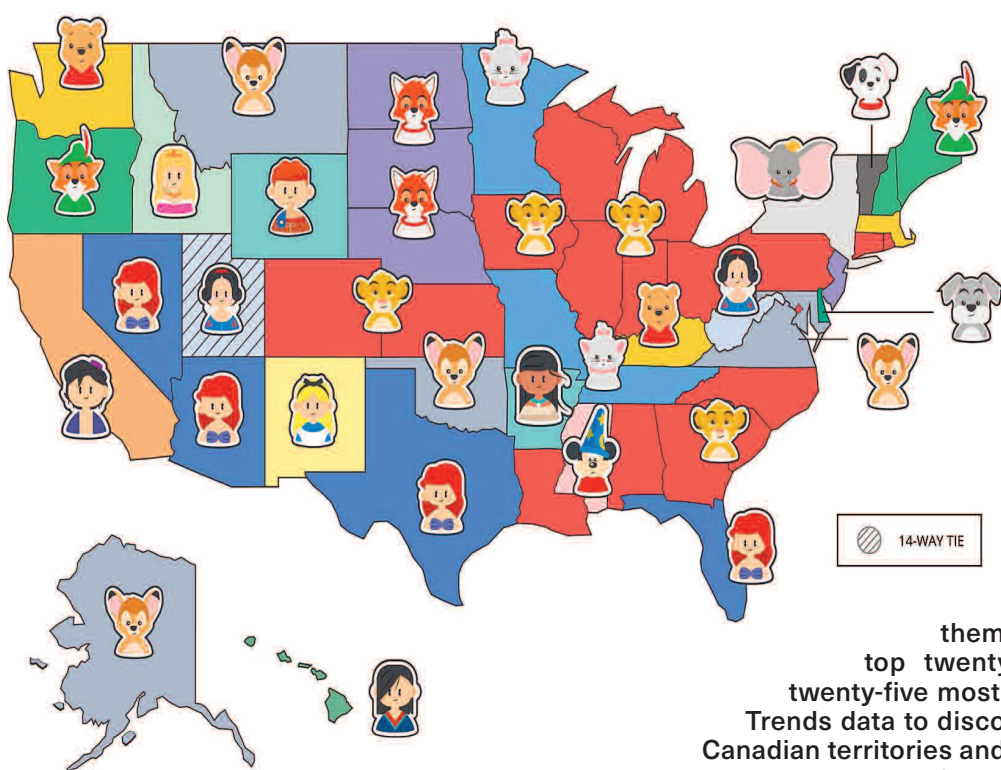

## Madison Jazz Society announces grant program

In October, the Madison Jazz Society will award grants, on a competitive basis, to school jazz centered programs. In 2017, almost \$6,000 in grants were awarded to schools throughout the state to enhance their jazz education programs.

Grant proposals may include, but are not limited to, help purchase instruments and

equipment, sheet music, play along CDs, books or videos and, to a lesser extent, clinics and hiring of guest artists. Final selection will be based partly on which proposal(s) provides the opportunity for the greatest number of students to learn about and/or participate in jazz related activities. Grant requests must be limited to \$500 per project to enable the Society to assist as many schools and projects as possible.

In addition, the Society will

award an upright string bass to a school that completes the application to receive it.

MJS members are available to serve as docents to participate in the conduct of approved projects. Schools can join together to submit a joint application for funding.

The application deadline is Oct. 1, 2018, and consists of a cover page that can be accompanied by a not more than two-page narrative telling of the

school's proposal.

## Federal grant in response to opioid crisis

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) has applied for an \$11.8 million federal grant to support Wisconsin's response to the opioid crisis. The funding is through the nearly \$1 billion State Opioid Response grant program administered by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and is available to all states and U.S. territories.

"This funding will boost our ongoing efforts to provide hope, health, and healing to those who need it the most," said DHS Director of Opioid Initiatives Paul Krupski. "We are saving lives, but there are more people to reach. This additional funding will help us sustain, enhance, and expand critical prevention, treatment, and recovery programs."

Wisconsin's plan will continue funding for initiatives recently de-

veloped under SAMHSA's State Targeted Response to the Opioid Crisis grant program. With the new funding, projects backed by Governor Scott Walker's Task Force on Opioid Abuse to reduce the non-medical use of opioids, reduce opioid overdose related deaths, and expand medication-assisted treatment will be supported beyond April 2019, when the initial funding was set to expire.

SAMHSA allocated the State Opioid Response grants using a formula based on drug overdose deaths and the proportion of residents who have a substance use disorder but don't receive treatment. Wisconsin recorded 1,031 drug overdose deaths in 2016. It is estimated that about 355,000 people needing substance use treatment in Wisconsin are not seeking or receiving it.

The new funding is expected to be awarded in September. It is an annual allocation available for two years.
