The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) has applied to support Wisconsin's response to the opioid crisis. The funding is through the nearly \$1 billion State administered by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and is available to all states and U.S. territories.

"This funding will boost our ongoing efforts to provide hope, dents who have a substance use health, and healing to those who disorder but don't receive treat-
