Edgerton continues record-breaking start

Records are made to be broken.

After breaking three school records in their season opener Aug.16, the Edgerton High School girl's swim team added two more top times to the books Tuesday, Aug. 21, including rebreaking a record the team broke just six days earlier.

"We've had a pretty good start to the season, and what's exciting is that it's not just the top few swimmers carrying us," head coach Margaret Cotter said.

Despite the second recordbreaking performance of the season, Edgerton was defeated by Lodi 96-73 in a non-conference meet hosted at Lodi High School. The Tide was missing five varsity swimmers at the event.

Junior Gaby de Moya-Cotter, sophomores Lena Seyfarth and Lexi Schultz and freshman Ruby Schieldt, rebroke the school

record they set in last week's 200 medley relay (2:01.49) with a time of 2:00.84. Unfortunately for Edgerton, they were just out touched by Lodi's 200 medley relay squad (2:00.38) in the event.

Schieldt also set a new school record in the 500 freestyle (5:33.93), crushing the previous record by almost 24 seconds. Schieldt placed first in the event and also touched the wall first in the 50 freestyle, clocking in at 26.68.

"Ruby is a really valuable addition to our team," Cotter said. "She is a very strong versatile swimmer and a great competitor. You put her in a close race and she is always going to find something extra to try to win."

Just like Schieldt, de Moya-Cotter also picked up a pair of individual victories at the meet. The junior placed first in the 100 freestyle and 100 backstroke with times of 55.21 and 1:01.64, respectively. Schieldt and de-Moya Cotter, along with Schultz and senior Leyla Ninmer, teamed

up for the top spot in the 400 freestyle relay with a time of 4:01.28.

Crimson Tide swimmers collected six personal best times at the event with Ninmer (two PRs), Seyfarth, junior Mimi Thompson, freshman Liv Miller and sophomore Angela Satterlee all earning PRs.

On Thursday, the Crimson Tide once again set a school record, while also getting their first taste of conference competition this year with the Southern Lakes Conference Relays in Whitewater.

With eight teams competing at the relays, Edgerton finished tied for fourth (352 points), just two points short of third-place Elkhorn.

Four relay teams medaled at the event, with first place finishes in the 100 freestyle and the 400 freestyle, and second place finishes in the 200 freestyle and 500 crescendo.

The relay team of Schieldt, Ninmer, Schultz and de

Moya-Cotter set a school record in the 400 freestyle, with a time of 3:53.45.

In the 100 freestyle relay senior Bailey Dowd, Schultz, Schieldt and de Moya-Cotter came out on top in a photo finish, as the Tide ended with a time of 50.12, while second place Jefferson-Cambridge clocked in at 50.40.

In the 200 freestyle relay de Moya-Cotter, Schultz, Dowd and Schieldt fell just short of Jefferson-Cambridge's team, clocking in at 1:46.50, less than a second off the first place pace.

Senior Tina Mikulcik. Schultz, Schieldt and de Moya-Cotter placed second in the 500 free crescendo relay, with a time of 5:01.81.

The Tide will be able to get some rest, as the team will not swim until they take on Whitewater on Thursday, Sept. 6. The meet will be held at the Edgerton pool.

"The whole team is improving and that's what we need to stay focused on moving forward," Cotter said.
