

Trojans Return Experienced Golfers This Season



The Barnesville Trojan Boys Golf team returns for another season on the links behind the tutelage of Coach Matt Askegaard, in his seventh season as leader of the Trojan golfers. The team returns three All-Conference players, with two of those players going to the 2017 Section golf meet.

Senior and 2018 captain, Charle Aakre, earned Heart O' Lakes All-Conference, as did freshman Adam Tonsfeldt, with both golfers making a trip to the Section 8AA golf meet. Add in junior Grant Inniger who also made the HOL All-Conference team, and Coach Askegaard has the makings of a very talented top three golfers to his six-man rotation.

"As a team, we finished last season in third place in the Heart O' Lakes Conference with Perham winning the title and Hawley coming in second," said Askegaard. "Charle Aakre and Adam Tonsfeldt advanced to the Section 8AA golf tourney. Adam had a fantastic first All-Conference golfers in our top Perham favored to win the section day shooting a 78, but struggled in six, while we also return our top meet.

state tourney. Charle was the exact opposite, as he had a rough first day before shooting a very respectable score on day two. Unfortunately, he did not move on to the state tourney either. Other golfers looking to crack the top six for the Trojans varsity squad include juniors, Luke Tonsfeldt and Jackson Ernst, sophomores. Graham Abarr, and Cole Loeks, and freshmen, Eric Ackerson, Mason Moen, Aaron Scheifert and Cole Swenson. Eighth-grader Logan Ernst also returns after gaining valuable experience on the varsity squad.

Junior high golfers include eighth graders Eric Church, Brady Dollison, Ryan Rustad, Dalton Rutherford and Lincoln Wahl, with seventh graders Gavin Grommesh, Tate Inniger, Isaac Maneval, Aaron Pearson, William Rotz and Theron Walseth looking to make their mark on the program in 2018.

"Grant Inniger also played very well last season and made the HOL All-Conference team," Askegaard said. "That gives us three

I am looking forward to a fun-filled 2018 season."
