a non-profit that creates AgInspire, organization educational exhibits to teach kids and adults the impact agriculture has on their lives, has modified an actual Case tractor head into a simulator. The exhibit gives people of all ages an opportunity to see what it is like to drive a piece of farm machinery.

Outfitted with a computer, main monitor and an external screen monitor, users can drive down a field using the controls to till, plant or harvest.

A feature display of mounted big game animals from three continents, five foreign countries, numerous states, six Canadian provinces and hunting concession destinations will be ready for viewing. The best



big game trophies accumulated from the United States, several Canadian provinces as well as the African countries of South Africa, Zimbabwe and Namibia will be highlighted.

A Wall of Shame display, courtesy of the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, will be available for viewing next to the Natural Resource Building.

The Turn In Poachers (TIP)

exhibit is an educational display dedicated to curbing the illegal taking of natural resources. The non-profit organization also educates the public about the effect of poaching on Minnesota's game and fish.
