







Raiders Hoping To Be Contenders In PTP Conference



The Lake Park-Audubon Raiders have Katy VanHavermaet back for her fourth year of coaching the varsity volleyball team. She will be assisted by Raina Asking, the junior varsity coach and varsity assistant. Also coaching is McKenzie Oistad for the C-team and varsity assistant. Junior high coaches are Melany Wynn and Sammi Sapa.

There are three seniors lost from last year's team: Rachel Grande as an outside attacker, Alexis Briard as the libero and Maria Miosek as the right side attacker. Last year the Raiders' overall record was 5-17. Their Pine-To-Prairie conference standing was sixth out of 12 teams. The team received the Gold Division Team Academic Award with a 3.75 GPA or higher.

Returning players for the Raiders are senior Carlie Ecker, 5'8" middle hitter, senior Kailee Lefebvre, 5'9" outside hitter, and senior Grace Bowers, 5'5" defensive specialist.

New Coach With Team Approach **Leads Lady Raiders**



A new coach, new assistant, new athletes, new leaders. It all is part of what the Lake Park-Audubon Lady Raider cross country team will deal with this year. However, it is always easier to deal with change when you have others by your side, like your team family.

The new coach this year is a familiar face to the LPA district but just starting out leading the Lady Raiders on their cross country journey.

Scott Eischens, activities director for LPA, is taking the head coaching role, and will be assisted by Ashley Tingelstad, also in her first year coaching the Raider harriers.

The Lady Raiders lost two girls to graduation and one more, a previous two-time state qualifier, because of a school transfer. That isn't daunting to the LPA runners at all. Coach Eischens emphasized that while cross country may seem like an individual sport, there is a strong team quality to it.

"It's about the team, not the individual. When you set a personal record or win a race, there are a lot of people who support you and push you."

But even so, team scores are calculated by individual finishes and it is always nice to have at least one runner to push the pace of the whole team. Luckily, the Lady Raiders are ready to step

into that challenge.

"We already have three girls ready to jump into those open roles and I'm super excited to see how they do," said Eischens.

"We have good numbers," said Eischens, "There are a few upperclassmen, mostly ninth and tenth graders, and some strong seventh and eighth graders."

It may be a younger team overall, but these girls have a solid work ethic and confidence in their abilities. Each runner strives to get better every day, which fits in with the team's goal: reaching their best performance.

In stressing the point, Eichens said, "They need to continue to get better, continue to improve as a team in order to get to their highest performance level."

That may look different for each athlete but when combined as a team, the Raiders will have another strong team in the works.

Eischens noted, "I just ask them to do what you can with what you have, continue to work, grow, and get better and make others better around you. Then the results will speak for themselves."
