The Barnesville Trojans traveled to Dilworth-Glyndon-Felton to take on the Rebels to open the 2018 football season. The Trojans had lost their starting quarterback and running back to injuries during the preseason. After an evenly paced first half that had the Rebels in front at the halfway point, the Trojans exploded for 22 unanswered points to win their opener 28-8.

The Trojans recovered a DGF fumble in the opening drive of the second half and found themselves four yards from the goal line. Quarterback Preston Snobl drove the first snap into the end zone.

From that point on, the defense shined and the Trojan offense took advantage of opportunities in dominating the second half.

Nick Detloff ripped through the Rebel defense, running up 144 yards in
