# Detloff Helps Leads Trojans To Victory Against Roseau

The Barnesville Trojan's Nick Detloff had a huge game, netting 181 yards rushing and three scores in leading Barnesville to a convincing 53-0 victory over Roseau in the second round of the playoffs and into the Section Championship game where they will face the Hawley Nuggets in a rematch of the last two championships.

After having to punt to open up the game, the Trojans caused a fumble on Roseau's first play from scrimmage with Barnesville's Brooks Martinson jumping on the ball at the 26-yard line.

Barnesville quickly moved the ball down the field as Adam Tonsfeldt connected with Chase Brenner for a 23-yard pass play, moving the ball to the three-yard line. Brenner would take the next carry into the end zone for the Trojans first score of the game. Kicker Connor Morse would make the extra point for a 7-0 lead.

The Trojans would force a punt on the next series and two plays later, running back Nick Detloff would take a hand off 78 yards for the first of his three straight rushing touchdowns. The PAT was not good making the score 13-0.

Barnesville would get the ball back after another punt and march down the field before Detloff ended the drive with an eight yard run. The two-point conversion pass was not good making the score 19-0, which is how the first quarter would end.

After Barnesville was forced to punt on their next possession, the Rams would jump offside to give the Trojans a new set of downs. Barnesville would make them pay as a few plays later, Detloff took another inside hand off and was off to the races for a 60-yard touchdown run. The extra point was blocked making the score 25-0 Barnesville.

The Trojans defense would force another Roseau punt that was blocked by Preston Snobl. It would

only take Barnesville three plays to get into the end zone as quarterback Adam Tonsfeldt found Snobl on a crossing pattern with Snobl running over a defender on his way for the score on a 30 yard touchdown pass and run. Brenner would add the two-point conversion that would make the score 33-0. The half would come to an end as Brenner added a late interception to stop a Rams drive and send both teams into halftime.

The second half would see Barnesville force a punt and take over the ball on the 31-yard line. It would only take one play for the Trojans to score as Tonsfeldt would find a seam up the middle and was off to the races for the score. The two-point conversion run by Kellen Hinsz was good making the score 41-0.

With the subs into the game, the Trojans would add two more scores with the first coming on a six yard run from Aaron Schiefert with the two-point conversion run falling short that made the score 47-0 as the third quarter came to an end.

Another methodical drive by the Trojans ended with a Logan Ernst two-yard touchdown run with the

two-point conversion run not being successful that made the score 53-0.

After a long kickoff return set up Roseau in great field position, the Trojans' Schiefert would step in front of a pass for an interception to end the threat and keep the shut out intact, as Barnesville went into victory formation to end the game with a 53-0 win.

"I felt we were ready for whatever they threw at us today as our intensity was very good from the beginning of the game and the kids went out and played very well," said Head Coach Bryan Strand. "Our offense was really clicking led by Nick Detloff, who had an outstanding day after fighting sickness the last few weeks. We still have some illness going around so hopefully that will pass soon.

It was a very physical game, but I felt we matched Roseau's intensity. We got out of the game healthy and will be ready to go next Friday when we play Hawley for the section title. I thought we played well the last time we played them, we just did not convert any of our two-point conversions and lost by one. Hopefully that will improve this

game.

I feel both teams are equally matched and the winner will come down to whoever makes the fewest mistakes. It should be another fantastic final between the two programs.

I have been very pleased with how hard our kids have been working and the steady progress they have shown throughout the year. I think we are starting to play our best football right now and hopefully that will continue."

The Trojans finished the game with 497 yards of offense with 420 yards coming on the ground and 70 yards through the air.

Detloff was the game's leading rusher with 181 yards on seven carries with three scores, while Tonsfeldt added 82 yards rushing on 10 carries and one touchdown, also completing all three passes for 55 yards and one score.

Schiefert tallied 65 yards rushing on eight carries with one score, with Brenner netting 52 yards rushing on seven carries and a touchdown, while adding two receptions for 25 yards.

Hunter Anderson added 12 yards on three carries, adding a reception that covered 15 yards, with Hinsz netting 10 yards on one carry, while Roller had 10 yards on two carries.

Jacob Morgan finished with seven yards on three carries, with Noah Krause netting six yards on one carry, while Logan Ernst had two yards on one carry that was good for a touchdown. Snobl had the other reception for the Trojans covering 30 yards and a touchdown to round out the offensive statistics.

Defensively, the Trojans were stellar again as they produced a shut out and held the Rams to 108 total yards of offense with 70 yards coming on the ground and 38 yards coming through the air, while netting three turnovers.

Hunter Zenzen was the defensive leader as he tallied six tackles (2 solo, 4 assist) with three for loss, a sack and a tackle on a kick, while Snobl added five tackles (2s,3a) three for loss, one tipped pass, a blocked kick

and a tackle on a kick.

Anderson tallied four tackles (3s,1a) with one for loss and one tackle on a kick, with Brady Kroll adding three tackles (1s,2a) including two for loss and a sack, while Tonsfeldt finished with seven assisted tackles, one for loss, a tackle on a kick and a tipped pass.

Brenner finished with an interception, two tackles (1s,1a) with one for loss, with Joey Mark netting four tackles (2s,2a) and a tackle on a kick, while Kaden Zenzen had two tackles (1s,1a) with one tackle on a kick with Morgan adding two tackles (1s,1a) and two tackles on kicks.

The victory improves the Trojans record to 8-2 on the season. Their next game will be on Friday, November 2 in the Fargo Dome against the Hawley Nuggets with game time slated for 8:00 p.m.
