Lady Braves win first section championship

The Lady Braves claimed their place in Menahga School history after a 56-52 victory over Belgrade-Brooten-Elrosa in the Section 5A championship game in Fergus Falls on Friday night.

The Lady Braves will now add to their legend as the first Menahga girls basketball team to play at the State Class A Tournament. Menahga, seeded 5, will start the tourney against Minneota, the 4-seed, at 1 p.m. on Thursday, March 15 at Williams Arena in Minneapolis. A complete bracket is featured elsewhere in this edition.

The Lady Braves bring a 30-0 record to the state quarterfinal, the only undefeated team in the tournament. Menahga has an effective field goal percentage of 49 percent over, 31 percent from three-point range and 62 percent from the free throw line.. They averaged 70 point per game offensively, with a defensive average of 38 points per game. In rebounding, the Lady Braves have a 71 percent overage on the defensive end and 46 percent on the offensive glass. The team has an assists to turnover ratio of .93.

Ahlf and Megan Hendrickson all average double digits scoring at 20, 17 and 15 points per game, respectively. In addition, Megan Hendrickson leads the team in rebounds with 324 Peterson in steals with 95 Central versus and Tara Hendrickson in Mountain Iron-Buhl assists with 79.
