Cost for the community fan bus is \$25.00 which includes the entrance fee. If a student rides the fan bus to the game, they must ride the return bus. The fan buses are first come first serve.

Cass Lake Mayor Jerry Smith said, "Those boys are amazing, and they are doing some amazing things. For them to play for the missing young man, Jeremy Jourdain, is simply a thing of honor. I wish them the best of luck and hope they take it all."
