There is a Hearing Aid representative who checks for hearing problems, also Pawnee County Health Office personnel check blood pressures every month and it is all free. 

Sunflower Diversified maintains local recycling service

Recycling in the City of Larned is a self-serve operation managed by Sunflower Diversified

Services in Great Bend.
Sunflower Diversified is a non-profit organization serving infants, toddlers and adults with developmental disabilities in Baron, Pawnee, Rice, Rush and Stafford Counties. The recycling

program is just one of its business ventures.

Sunflower maintains bins in the Larned Industrial Park located at 1423 105th Ave. on the eastern outskirts of the community. Patrons are responsible for sorting and depositing recyclable materials. The bins are available 24 hours a day, seven days per week.

Items accepted include: miscellaneous paper, including office paper and carbonless

forms; non-corrugated construction paper and corrugated cardboard; plastic pop, juice and milk bottles; aluminum cans, plates and foil; and steel or tin cans.

Non-acceptable items include: carbon paper; wax paper, plastic food containers; motor oil or chemical containers; window glass, batters, or Styrofoam.
