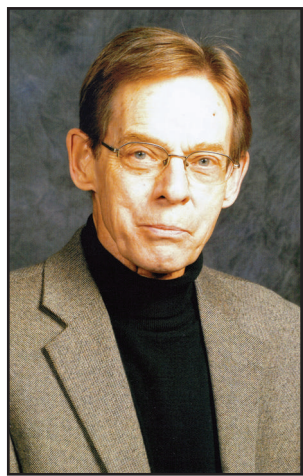

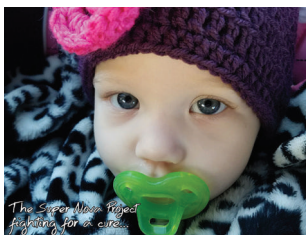

Mr. Jaynes says.

Jaynes continued: "There was time, a hundred years or so ago, when the organ provided the vast majority of live, serious music heard publicly, not only in church but in municipal auditoriums and venues all over the country. Of course there is also the association with silent movies as well, but that was only an outgrowth of the other usage. So I have also relied on those relationships as a source for musical material as

The concert will be presented in memory of three of the children of the Kans for Kids family that lost their battles with cancer earlier this year. Dade Cannon, 14, passed away on January 12, 2018 after a 9 year battle with leukemia. He is the son of Christy Huslig, Great Bend. Nova Martensen, 2, lost her battle with AT/RT on January 21, 2018. She is the daughter of Heaven Williams and Josh Martensen, Great Bend. Gael Bujanda, 4, passed away on Feb. 7, 2018 after battling Medulloblastoma for several months. He is the son of Jesus and Yansi Bujanda, Great Bend. Craig serves as Music Director and Organist for St. Colman Church in Washington Court House, Ohio and is in his 56th year as a practicing church musician. The afternoon was taken up with the parade which started at 1:30 o'clock, the horse show on the high school athletic field and free acts on Main street and in the evening, the free acts were repeated and the carnival, marry-go-round, ferris wheel, loop-a-whirl and a wide variety of concessions had a big business until midnight.

The parade was headed by a load speaker car from the Hutchinson State Fair followed by the flags and men of the American Federation of Labor, American Legion, Uncle Sam and the airbase band.

Four 4-H Club floats were in the parade and each received \$15, but the floats were not rated. They were the Eureka Homesteaders, the Willing Workers, Claflin 4H

and Ft. Zarah 4-H Club.

Chas. Glover was the lone high-wheeled bicyclist but there was a squadron of boys and girls on bikes in the parade, also a variety of clowns and advertisements for various business firms.

The big feature of the parade was the horses – 119 of them, and some were the classy kind you see at the American Royal. The Hoisington High School band took part in the parade and also played during the horse show at the high school athletic field.

The crowd in the grand stand and on the high school athletic field rivaled the crowd that saw the Hoisington-Stafford high school football game two years ago.
