River squad in 2018

The Redskins advanced to the 8-Man, Div. I playoffs in 2016 in spite of a losing record. Last year, new head coach Chad Lafferty got his team back on the plus side with a 7-3 record and another playoff berth. This year, Lafferty has back five starters on both sides of the ball but must replace some key skill players.

"This year our team's success will greatly depend upon our offensive line," Lafferty said. "We have a lot of experience returning at those positions, and if they can continue to build upon their success at the end of last season, they have the potential to be very good. Our skill players have decent speed and if our line can open up some gaps in the defense they have the capability of creating a big play."

Little River returns three of its starting linemen from a year ago in seniors Trey Baldwin (6-3, 295) under center, and seniors Kody Hawkinson (6-0, 275) and Ethan Schafer (5-10, 200) at guard.

Gone to graduation are Levi Swenson and Peyton Harvey. As quarterback, Swenson, who threw for 661 yards and eight touchdowns and rushed for another 529 yards and 10 scores. Harvey rushed for 659 yards and 13 scores.

But that offensive line will be trying to make room for last year's biggest threat in senior Hunter Thomas. As a junior, Thomas ran the ball 93 times for 711 yards and 17 touchdowns to earn first-team Wheat State League

The new quarterback loses the team's top receiver last year in Harvey, but Brayden Sears returns as fullback and tight end after earning first-team all-league honors in 2017. He pulled in five receptions for 90 yards.

That group will also form a talented defense. Sears earned first-team all-league honors last year at linebacker with 103 tackles. Thomas was a first-team all-leaguer at defensive back, and sophomore Graham Stephens earned an all-league honorable mention as a defensive back. Hawkinson and Schafer return as defensive ends.

We return the most experience in the defensive backfield and the defensive end position," said Lafferty. "Key to our defense is everyone doing their job and reading their keys. We will need to shore up the middle with a nose guard and another linebacker."

Stephens will once again kick and punt for the Redskins. Fifty-two of his 62 kicks last year resulted in touchbacks, and he averaged just over 48 yards a punt. Lafferty also expects big things out of senior Matt Dougherty (6-0, 178) as a tight end and wideout.

Last year, Little River's three losses came against teams with a combined 24-7 record, including Central Plains. The Oilers will again be pushing for a district title, but the Redskins will see some new district teams in Pratt-Skyline, Macksville, and Moundridge with Ellinwood moving back to the 11-man ranks.

Schneider takes over Chase football team

After three-straight winning seasons, including a pair of unbeaten regular seasons in 2014 and 2015, the Chase football team took a couple steps back last year to finish at 2-7. With seven starters back, Brent Schneider has higher expectations for his first season as head coach with the Kats.

"We have a solid group of kids that work hard and are willing to do what it takes to steer the program in the right direction," said Schneider. "They have worked hard this summer and are ready to get on the field and start putting it all together."

Schneider brings a wealth of experience to the program. He was a 4-year player at Sterling High School and Sterling College. He was a defensive back in college. He spent a season as a student coach at Sterling College before taking an assistant coaching job at El Dorado High School for three years. From 2014-2016, Schneider was the head coach in Ellsworth, leading the Bearcats to a 15-13 record.

"I bring a Christian and servant leader mentality," he said. "Also, I was very fortunate to have terrific mentors and role models as coaches during my time as a player. I look to fill that role for the students in USD 401."

As for the players, senior Lance Hinderliter established himself as the team's quarter back last year.

Team statistics on maxpreps.com do not included losses against Sylvan-Lucas or Ashland. In Hinderliter's six games listed, he completed 26 of his 60 pass attempts for 330 yards, four touchdowns, and four interceptions. He was also the main threat on the ground with 303 yards and eight touchdowns on 89 attempts.

Sophomores Dylan Miller and Tylon Ibarra also return as offensive threats. In his seven games listed last year, Miller rushed for 292 yards and four touchdowns on 75 carries. Ibarra ran the ball 79 times in those seven games for 290 yards and three scores.
