Diaz ready to make varsity running debut in Lyons

<u>By MIKE COURSON</u> It was just a few years ago that Samantha Trejo debuted on the high school varsity scene and tore up the cross country course for four years as a Lady Lion. Now it's Eric Diaz's turn. After putting together unbeaten seventh and eighth-grade seasons at Lyons Middle School, Diaz sets his sights on high school competition in 2018.

Lyons has had state representation in recent years. Marc Reyes ran 68th at the state meet last October, and Oscar Jaime placed 12th at state as a senior in 2016. Late last season, Diaz cruised to the win in Sterling by 55 seconds in 11:25 on the 2-mile course. Only time will tell how long Diaz can remain unbeaten at the next level against better competition and on a longer course.

Second-year head coach Zack Vogel expects big things from Luis Barroteran and wants to see all his runners gain valuable experience this fall. "I expect the team to grow a lot this season," he said. "We are a really young team, so there will be a lot of learning going on. These young runners will learn how to train and race hard as the season progresses."

Sept. 20 opens a big 2-week stretch for the Lions. The team runs in Larned that day, then heads to Rim Rock just two days later. The big home meet follows on Sept. 25, and the team stays in Rice County at the Sterling Invite on Oct. 4.




