Cook takes over healthy Lady Cardinal golf program

"We bring back a solid core of girls this year," Cook said. "We want to defend our league and regional titles as well as improve on our fourth-place finish at state last year."

The Lady Cards did lose a pair of state scorers to graduation. Hadleigh Gardner finished 21st at state and Jaci Schremmer placed 22nd to help pick up team

That means Cook has back two state scorers and two more state competitors. Senior Maleigha Schmidt led last year's team at the Smoky Hill Country Club with a 95 for seventh overall. Senior Trinity Dolezal tied teammate Schremmer in 22nd. Freshman Addison Smith finished 57th overall, and senior Liza Ward finished 63rd.

The bad news for Schmidt and company is that most of last year's top golfers should be back this fall. TMP senior Hsiang Chin beat last year's field by five strokes with a 76. In all, just one of the top-nine and four of the top-17 golfers from state have


In the team race that could loom large as reigning state champion Syracuse loses its No. 3 scorer from state. Johnson County, Goodland,


