Effort impresses Panthers' new head coach in first scrimmage against Trenton

First-year head coach Kyle Pack unveiled his version of Martin Middle School football in his first scrimmage against Trenton on Tuesday.

His version looked similar to some of former head coach John Lifsey's teams – tough with big play-making ability.

The run-game looked solid after losing its explosive weapon from last year in Marquis Taylor. He has taken his highlight ability over to Westview as a freshman.

In steps eighth-grade running back Javion Goins to fill the spot. Goins showed what he can with a pair of long touchdowns in Martin's first offensive set. He broke through the line and went 50 yards on the first one and followed that up a couple of plays later with a 40-yard scoring run.

"He really motored it up tonight," Pack said. "He had some big gains for us, that is for sure."

It was not only his long runs that were impressive; he also kept his legs moving forward for an extra yard or two when Trenton was able to wrap him up.

Dearea Nicholson joined Goins in the backfield and

he also had some good gains.

There were some problems with the offense. The one that stood out the most and more worrisome for Pack than anything is some bad snaps from the center.


"If we can just get a good snap from the center I think we will be alright," Pack said. "We have to do a better job at protecting the football. We did put it on the ground a couple of times."

The Panthers have an experienced quarterback in Ty Simpson and he instinctively knew what to do with the bad snaps. He either fell on the loose ball or picked it and turned a potential bad play into a positive one.

One particular play that stood out happened on the final play of Martin's second offensive set. It was another busted play on a bad snap. Simpson bought some time by scrambling with ball and found an open receiver in the back of the end zone for a 20-yard touchdown.

Simpson also connected with Luke Brown for a 40yard score in the first offensive set. The Panthers scored three times in their first set and once in the sec-
