Every team's greatest strength should be in the trenches. Games are won or lost up front. The Chargers should be solid on the offensive line this year. Pack has three players who are not only strong and agile but also experienced.

It will help the running game and the pass protection to have that kind of experience on the offensive line.

"Right now I have three guys who were either starters as seventh-graders or who had significant playing time," the head coach said. "Jayden Johns, Micah Daniels and Luke Brown all started or began having playing time halfway through last season. That is definitely going to be a big plus for us. Christian Ingram and Austin Brent will have to be my guards. We played five junior varsity games last year and they played in all of those."

The head coach will make changes to his starting 11 on
