"He has asserted himself to be the leader, verbally and by example. He is always encouraging the guys, correcting things, and just doing what is right. I could not ask for a better situation heading into the season."

It takes more than just having a good quarterback to win games. It takes a team effort, which the Chargers had in the jamboree. Martin had a balanced offensive game with several players contributing in the win.

The Chargers are expected to carry that over into the season. They have a pair of running backs in Quincy Hamilton and Will Gal-



limore

Hamilton and Gallimore will carry most of the load in the run game, but opposing teams will also see Damron take off with the ball when he sees an open lane to run through.


Then there are the receivers,


