The Top Team...

1. Covington CHARGERS

The Chargers made it all the way to the Class 3A state title game and finished as the runnerup to Alcoa with a 13-2 record. Head coach Marty Wheeler, 85-54 overall, will be entering his 10th year at Covington (71-38) and has 14 returning starters. That gives the Chargers the edge as preseason favorites to repeat as the Region 7-3A champions. The Chargers have seven starters returning on offense, led by senior quarterback Brock Lomax, senior running back Cordarius Page and senior fullback Ke'Shun Gant. The offensive line will be the biggest concern for Wheeler as he lost four of his five starters to graduation.

The Rest...

2. Milan BULLDOGS

A new era is beginning at Milan as Craig Pettigrew takes over the helm after Jeff Morris retired from coaching at the end of last season. The biggest question entering the season for the Bulldogs is how they will respond to a new head coach for the first time in 22 years. There is plenty of experienced players to guide the Bulldogs under a new head coach with eight returning players on offense and seven on the defense. Senior quarterback Taylor Lockhart and senior running back Jimari Weathers are the players Pettigrew will look to for leadership this season. Weathers will have to carry the load in the run-game after Milan lost Anthony Ballard to graduation. 3. Westview CHARGERS

The rebuilding process is nearly complete for Westview and head coach Trey Cantrell. Inside the trenches will be where the Chargers are expected to dominate this season. 4. Bolivar TIGERS

The Tigers will not be as explosive offensively this year as it has the last couple of season. Head coach Woodrow Lowe lost too much offensive production to graduation with only three returning starters back for 2018. Senior Jace McKenzie will take over at quarterback and he is basically untested as he had to wait it out on the sidelines with Lowe handling the quarterback duties.

championship game. Taylor Lockhart (Milan, QB, 6-0, 170, Sr.)



Jace McKenzie (Bolivar, QB, 6-3, 173, Sr.)

The Tigers no longer have Trey Lowe at quarterback, so now they will depend on McKenzie to guide the offense. The senior quarterback has so much riding on his back as he will attempt to lead the Tigers in the region, which is tough on any new quarterback.

Ty Simpson (Westview, QB, 6-1, 176, Fr.)

This appears to be the year for quarterbacks in Region 7-3A and the Chargers have one to watch for the next four seasons. Simpson has a lot of upside to his game as the Chargers finally have a quarterback who reads coverages well, gives them a deep threat and is very good at running with the football.
