Yates and Huffstetler can be put at any position offensively where they can get the ball in their hands. Both are speedy and are a threat to score when they touch the ball.


One thing about Yates and Huffstetler — each can play quarterback as both were used there by their teams last season.

And all four of our cover guys





Rivalries we need to see again

Once upon a time there were some great rivalries played involving the county's four teams and at one time there were five high school teams in Weakley County.

Sharon no longer has a high school and football team. However, the Eagles were involved in rivalries with several teams. Most of them with the other county high school teams.

Dresden, Greenfield, Westview and Gleason all had traditional rivalries that no longer exist. It would be nice to see some of them renewed.

Games the Lions use to play when it was in District 13A, and in Class AA were some of the most heated in the area. Some of those teams were McKenzie, Huntingdon, Bruceton, and even Milan.

The Rebels, Mustangs and Tigers are in a different region now, but they are still in the same classification. Big crowds were always expected when the Lions hooked up annually with the Rebels, Mustangs and Tigers.

Dresden had some of its greatest battles against McKenzie and Huntingdon. The Lions and Mustangs met on the field in the season finale from 2011-14. Cars were lined up along Highway 22 when the game was played at Dresden. It was the same way when the Lions played McKenzie at home. Those are two teams that would be nice to see back on the schedule.

Gleason also used to have McKenzie and Huntingdon regularly on the schedule. The Bulldogs did not have much success with those two teams, but the game drew big crowds and created an awesome high school football atmosphere, especially the McKenzie games.

The Bulldogs and Rebels are just a few miles apart and this is one rivalry that should be renewed.

Greenfield is the one team in the county, which has basically kept its rivalries intact over the years. It annually plays South Fulton, Gleason, Fulton City, West Carroll, Lake County, Humboldt, and recently had to put Dresden back on the schedule due to being in the same region once again.

There are a couple of teams the Yellowjackets no longer play, but were good games to go see. Gibson County comes to mind. The Pioneers and Yellowjackets were normally evenly matched. Greenfield and Gibson County did meet in the Dyer County Jamboree and maybe that will lead to the both teams playing each other once again on a regular basis.

Matching up the Yellowjackets with McKenzie is another rivalry that could be renewed. It is a short bus ride between the two towns on Highway 124. There would not be any travels concerns and it would be good for each of the town's economies if these two teams could play each other once again.

One team comes to mind for Westview and it a rivalry that is way past overdue in renewing. The game that should and needs to be on the schedule annually is the Chargers against Union City.

This was one of the greatest rivalries in all of northwest Tennessee. It has been a decade since the Chargers and Tornadoes last met. This was one of the top games to attend and it really got heated up when Westview use to be called Martin High School it began the amazing 42-0 streak against Union City.

Then the Tornadoes ended it in the season opener in 1971. There was no love lost when that happened as the Martin fans despised UC.
