DEFENSE


One piece of the puzzle that is missing on defense from last season is linebacker Nicholas Mitchell, who graduated in May. Mitchell was the defensive general and led the team in total tackles, sacks, quarterback hurries and tackles for loss of yardage.

Now that falls on the shoulders of Arnold and Capps. Arnold will anchor the defensive line, while Capps should be the top linebacker.

Pitt will be able to keep some of his starting linebackers fresh.

"We have a few linebackers that are not going to play offense," the head coach said. "They will only be on defense to give us some rest at that spot."


