from Brock's Chapel community.

She says she thought, though he had been deceased for two decades, "My dad would really like to see me do this. It's time for a woman."

She points to what she believes is a woman's ability to see things that men might not always see such as things that need to be cleaned up as one reason she's seen success.

She's also not afraid of hard work. She's always had three jobs. When she was teaching, she had special education classes and two nights a week taught adult high school while also working retail. She still works at Walmart, a position she's held for 16 years.

She says she's a people person

who enjoys meeting new people. While her dad conveyed the importance of hard work, having run his service station seven days a week, her mother, employed at a Union City bank, also showed her how to balance job and family.

"My mom prepared me for everything, the worst and the best. She let me know I could talk to her about anything. I sure do miss her," she said noting that her loss came only two years ago. "She was my best friend. I still can't take her phone number out of my phone."

Cindy admits that some might call her family "workaholics." She doesn't see it as problematic.

"The Lord has blessed me," she concludes. "I'm lucky. I'm getting to do what he has prepared me for."
