After one year, in July of 1944, Norman left the Citadel and joined the Navy to serve his country during World War II, at the age of 18. He was trained as a signalman and assigned to the merchant ship, SS Margaret Lykes, where he served on the open bridge communicating using visual semaphore with flashing lights and flags and was known by his shipmates as "Flags." Ports of call included Guam, Cuba, and South America.

During one of his home leaves, he met the love of his life, Joy Ann Rich, a farm girl from neighboring Arcola. They wrote letters back and forth until he was discharged in June of 1946. Norman and Joy were married in Arcola on September 19, 1947.

Great-grandfather Cassius Marcelus Clay Weller gave Norman his 1931 Chevy, "Old Mini," and the young couple moved to Terre Haute, Indiana, where Norman attended and graduated from Rose Poly Tech, with a BS degree in Civil Engineering in 1949.
