

many years. The Illinois Master Naturalist program is very similar, but the focus of outreach by volunteers is environmental stewardship. The program is designed to educate and train a corps of volunteers to provide support in the conservation,

management, and interpretation of the area's natural resources in collaboration with local partners.

The training provides science-based educational opportunities that connect people with nature and help them become engaged environmental stewards.

The initial 40 hours of training will be presented at Douglas-Hart Nature Center through sessions that include lecture, discussion, and hands-on activities.

Training will be every Tuesday from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. beginning September 11 and continuing through October 23.

An additional orientation and introductory meeting is scheduled for 6 p.m. on August 28.

With the help of local experts, University of Illinois Extension provides the educational support for the program, while volunteering is typically coordinated through local partners.

In our Extension Unit, program partners currently include Douglas-Hart Nature Center, Grand Prairie Friends, and the Coles County Soil and Water Conservation District.

Volunteer Master Naturalist service projects may include wetland, forest, and prairie restoration; fish, wildlife, and plant inventories; environmental education programs for youth and adults; and interpretive tours at the visitor center. The list of volunteer activities is endless.

The distribution is part of the Foodbank's Foodmobile Program, a system of mobile food pantries designed to help bring nutritious food to areas of chronic or extreme need.

All eligible residents of Piatt County who are in need of food and grocery product are welcome to attend the Foodmobile distribution.

To be eligible, a household must have an income at or below 185% of the federal poverty level, or approximately \$3,793 per month for a family of four. Full eligibility criteria are listed below.

Maximum monthly income per eligible household (for each additional household member over 8, add \$644):

Household Size/Monthly Income: 1-\$1,859; 2-\$2,504; 3-\$3,148; 4-\$3,793; 5-\$4,437; 6-\$5,081; 7-\$5,726; 8-\$6,370.
