

In what proved to be a defensive battle the 7th grade Knights battled back all night long to tie the game with just a little over a minute left to play at 12-12. But Monticello hit a freethrow late and the young Knights missed a couple of scoring opportunities that proved to be the difference. Addi Erwin scored five points, Brooklyn Matheny four and Mackenzie Condill three for the only Knights in the scoring column.

The 8th grade Knights found themselves down early 9-0 and then 11-3 by the end of the first quarter. However, they got enough offense rolling in the second quarter to grab a 12-11 lead at the half. The Knights slowly built up the final ten point lead by midway in the

fourth quarter and were able hold on for the 10 point win.

Coach Farmer's comments: "I am really proud of both teams for the way they battled Thursday night.
