

Cerro Gordo moved into the third place game on Thursday night at ALAH HS in Arthur to face the

Southeast Division runner-up Heritage.

The Broncos came out a bit flat in the first game against the Hawks who took advantage and took the set 25 - 16. CGHS bounced back in game two and held on in the end to defeat Heritage 25 - 23.

With the match tied at one game each, the third game would decide who won the match and third place overall in the LOVC. Heritage was strong again throughout this game while the Broncos once again seemed just a bit out of sync. The orange and blue played hard but lost the game 25 - 14.

Cerro Gordo will have played Argenta-Oreana this week and will play Sangamon Valley/Tri-City at home on Thursday, October 11 which will be Senior Night.

The Broncos will compete in the Champaign St. Thomas More Invitational this Saturday before finishing the regular season with three games on the road against Sullivan, Decatur LSA and Blue Ridge.
