Broncos outlast Knights in thrilling Little Okaw football contest

It was Homecoming weekend at Cerro Gordo High School; a wonderful fall evening for football featuring two teams both looking for much needed victories. All of that and more created a great atmosphere for high school football under the lights on a Friday night; the Broncos and Knights did not disappoint.

ALAH made the initial score in the game with Adam Day crossing the goal line at about the end of the opening quarter. This came after a huge sideline run by Day to put the ball close to the goal line. The Aaron Likens point after was good for a 7 - 0 Knights lead.

The Broncos marched down the field completing a fourth down and one on the visitor's 32 yard line. Ethan Mann would end up punching the ball into the end zone however the ensuing extra point try was no good due to a low snap. CGB trailed 7-6.

After a reverse play on the return, ALAH was set up with good field position at the Broncos 40 yard line. With 8:20 to go in the first half, it was Day breaking free again for a 51 yard touchdown scamper. Likens extra point sailed through the uprights and the lead was now 14 - 6 in favor of Arthur Lovington Atwood Hammond.

CGB was stopped on downs in the next series but a Knights fumble led

to a short two yard TD run. With 3:51 left in the second quarter it was once again a one point game with ALAH leading 14 - 13.

The first half excitement was not over, however, in one of the games big plays Mann hit Matthew Guffey 18 yards down the field with Guffey doing the rest to complete a 75 yard play with just six seconds left. The EP was good and the Broncos went into the locker room at halftime with a 20 - 14 lead.

It was the red, black and gold defense making a big stop when the Broncos had the ball first and goal with 7:58 to go in the third quarter. It was the Knights Billy Fifer breaking free for a huge 94 yard score. The extra point attempt was no good so the game was tied at 20 - 20 with 7:41 left in the third.

The next score came from the home team on a 28 yard pass from Mann to Gage Taylor-Barker. Another McDermith kick and the Broncos were back in front by seven, 27 - 20 with 5:44 left in the third stanza.

ALAH began their next drive at their own 24 yard line. The Knights were marching down the field. ALAH completed a huge fourth down play to keep the drive alive. With 11:52 left to go in the final quarter Lance Mercer hit Day for a 27 yard score and with the extra point the game was knotted back up at 27. On the ensuing kickoff,

Brady Borntreger of ALAH recovered a CGB fumble. This put the Knights back in business and they made the most of it. A four yard touchdown run by Day and a successful point after gave the visitors the lead 34 - 27.

The last score of regulation came with 3:30 left as CGB's Sam Dalton took the ball in from the five yard McDermith's kick line. was up and good and the game was tied at 34 which is where it remained as the clock expired.

The Knights won the overtime toss and opted to play defense first. The home team wasted no time with Mann tossing a TD pass to Taylor-Barker on the very first play. ALAH came out for their shot at the end zone edging ever closer to the goal line. However, on fourth and goal from the one yard line a Knights pass barely fell incomplete. Cerro Gordo-Bement had secured a very important, hard-fought win in a very memorable Little Okaw Valley Conference contest between these two rivals.

The 41 - 34 victory put the Broncos record at 4 wins 3 losses. A win at Niantic this Friday night against Sangamon Valley will make the team playoff eligible. If Cerro Gordo-Bement does beat the Storm and then secures a Senior Night victory over Villa Grove-Heritage on Friday, October 19 CGB will be assured a playoff spot.

It took an extra period of football to decide the victor in the game at Cerro Gordo last Friday night. In a hard fought, back and forth contest, the Broncos scored on their overtime possession and the Knights' pass on fourth down of their series fell incomplete.

The Knights got on the scoreboard first on a 6 yard run by Adam Day with thirty seconds left in the first quarter. The extra point kick by Aaron Likens was good and the visitors led 7-0.

CGB answered with a 28 yard td run by Ethan Mann just two minutes into the second. The kick was no good so the Knights held on to a slim 7-6 lead.

Two minutes later, Adam Day would score his second rushing touchdown on a 51 yard run. After the Likens kick, the lead was 14-6 in favor of the Knights.

The Broncos turned the ball over on down but unfortunately the Knights gave up a fumble to give the ball back to the home team. They would score after a short drive with Mann carrying the ball 1 yard into the end zone. An EP kick by Wes McDermith brought them back to within one

point of the visitors, 13-14.

Adam Day and then after Brady Borntreger recovered a Bronco fumble on the ensuing kickoff, Fifer scored his second touchdown of the game on a 3 yard run. After Likens two extra point kicks, the Knights were back on top 34-27.

CGB would tie the game again on a 5 yard run by Sam Dalton and a McDermith kick. This came with 3:30 remaining in the game. Neither team could get anything going on their remaining drives and the horn sounded with the scoreboard reading 34 all.

The Knights won the overtime coin toss and elected to go on defense first. CGB' QB Mann connected with Barker-Taylor on the first play of their possession for a touchdown. McDermith's kick made the score 41-34 with the Knights getting their chance in OT starting at the 10 yard line. They got the ball to the 3 on the first three plays but Mercer's pass to Day on fourth down was oh so close, but fell incomplete. Despite the great effort throughout the game the Knights came up just short and fell to 2-5 on the season.
