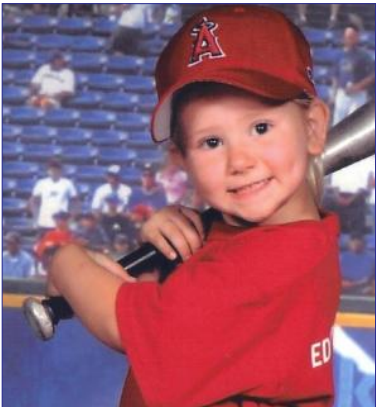

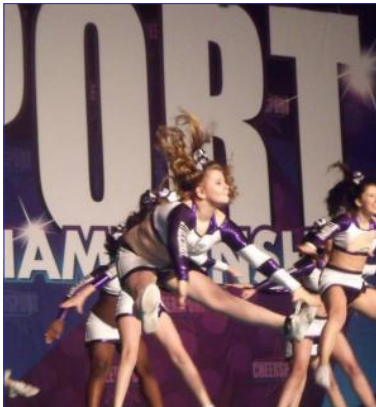

you never stopped putting in hard work and raising the bar.

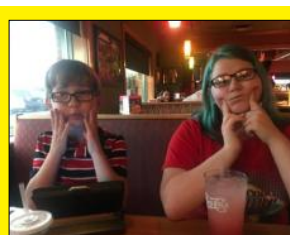
