- A Medicare / Medicaid Card A Mississippi Voter Registration Card

- Any of the following, as long as it includes the voter's name and current address: utility bill, bank statement, paycheck of government check issued within the past six months or an IRS Form W-2, Wages and Tax Statement issued within the current calendar year.

documents, call the Greene County Circuit Clerk's office for information on getting a state-issued ID card.

"Mississippi is the only state where if you know your date of birth, state of birth and mother's maiden name, county officials can look up your birth certificate for free," Secretary of State Delbert Hosemann said. "That will give you the information needed to obtain a Voter ID."

Hosemann went on to say that Voter IDs will be issued on election day and even for seven days after that, allowing people to vote by affidavit ballot and then use the Voter ID to verify the ballot cast.

Women who have much of their documents in their husband's name (i.e., Mrs. John Doe) can use their current ID, as the date of birth, address and other information provided from those IDs will be sufficient
