

Can't make it to the polls on election day? No problem, cast your vote by absentee ballot

Some registered voters are eligible to vote by an absentee ballot because of age, health, work demands, temporary relocation for educational purposes, or their affiliation with the U.S. Armed Forces.

According to Circuit Clerk Cecelia Bounds, a voter in Mississippi can vote absentee in an election if he or she cannot make it to the polls on Election Day for one of the following reasons:

- The voter will be outside of his or her home county on Election Day.

- The voter is a "student, teacher or administrator at a school whose studies or employment there necessitates" absence from the voter's home county on Election Day (spouses and dependents of such voters are also eligible to vote absentee)

- The voter is disabled and therefore unable to vote in person

- The voter is the parent, spouse or dependent of a disabled person "who is hospi-

talized outside of [his or her] county of residence or more than 50 miles away" and will be with the disabled person on Election Day

- The voter is 65 years old or older

- The voter is required to be at work on Election Day during polling hours.

Voters who are unsure if they are eligible to vote by absentee ballot, should call the circuit clerk's office at (601)394-2379 for more information and to learn the procedures for doing so.

Voters who know they will vote by an absentee ballot, may contact the clerk's office at any time within 45 days of the election. The deadline to apply for an absentee ballot is noon on the Saturday prior to the election, which is Aug. 3 for the upcoming primaries. Mailed ballots must be received by the clerk's office by 5 p.m. on the day before the election.

Voters can also cast an absentee ballot in person at

the clerk's office, but must do so by the Saturday prior to the election deadline (Aug. 3 for the upcoming primaries).

The Greene County Circuit Clerk's Office will be open Aug. 3 until noon to accommodate voters who wish to vote by absentee.

Voters included within the Uniform and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA), such as members of the military and overseas citizens, may register to vote and request an absentee ballot by Federal Post Card Application (FPCA). UOCAVA voters may register to vote using the FPCA up until ten days before the date of an election and may receive and return an absentee ballot by mail, email, or fax until 7 p.m. on election day.


