ing into the 2019 season. Head coach Steve Buckley's Bobcats have won back-to-back MACJC South Division titles and return the bulk of last year's roster, including starting offensive linemen Jordan Chapman, a 2018 Greene County graduate.

Last season Jones went 10-2 (6-0 in MACJC South Division) and defeated Eastern Arizona College 27-7 in the Mississippi Bowl. Jones ended the season ranked No. 5 in the final NJCAA poll and is looking to be back in the thick of things again this year.

Chapman (6-2, 294) played in nine games at tackle for the Bobcats a year ago. He lines up in practice quite often against his former teammate at

GCHS, Blake Daughdrill, who was a dominant force for the Wildcats last season. Daughdrill is competing for playing time on the defensive line for JCJC this year.

Jones opens the season at Coahoma on Aug. 29 ranked as the No. 4 team in the pre-season NJCAA poll. Along with the matchup with ECCC to end the regular season, Jones will host Pearl River for Homecoming on Oct. 5 in another game of keen interest for Wildcat fans.


That matchup will feature four former Wildcats as 2019 graduates Noah Mitchell and Hayden West are lining up for the PRCC Wildcats this season. Mitchell and West have both impressed coaches in

preseason camp and each are competing for starting positions at linebacker and offensive center, respectively.

PRCC opens its season Aug. 29 at Itawamba. The Wildcats then visit East Mississippi on Sept. 5 before hosting Copiah-Lincoln on Sept. 12 in the 2019 home opener.


