Carey Conservation and Sportsman's Association marks its 60th anniversary this year.

The club has its roots in the Carey Conservation League, which a group of men organized 80 years ago on Jan. 31, 1939. Thirty years after the Conservation League was founded, the Carey Conservation and Sportsman's Association was officially incorporated in 1959. It came about with the creation of club grounds. The recreational park was established on a 40-acre tract purchased by the sportsman's club east of Carey at the intersection of Mitten and Virden roads.

The first officers were elected in April of that year: Nelson Stover, president; Vincent Snyder, vice president; Raymond Peiffer, secretary; John Welsh, agent and director; Anthony Fabiani, chairman of hunting committee and director; James Gatchell, chairman of fishing committee and director; Roscoe Row, director.

The club grounds developed to include two firing ranges, camping, fishing, shooting, a clubhouse, volleyball court, horseshoe pits, playground, picnic shelter house and swimming pool. Over the years the club has hosted trout and fishing derbies, hunter safety courses and is presently working on an archery program

with target range. Last year Carey Conservation and Sportsman's Association started hosting bands.
