Shirley Roberson presented the council with Russell County Health Department Study Assessment and encouraged the council and the city to attend the next monthly meeting.

David Burton, President of the Russell County Jaycee and Dustin Adkins, Secretary and Treasurer attended this months meeting on behalf of the Russell County Conservation Office in regards to asking the City Council to sponsor them to build a new agricultural center at the Russell County Fair Grounds. They are currently working toward receiving a grant by the state of a 50/50 match program to build a new 100 x 200 agriculture building with concrete floors and portable stalls. The team informed the council that this new facility can be used for various agriculture events such as FFA, 4-H agriculture events as well as a farmers market for the community. The council voted to table the subject until the next monthly meeting after further budget details have been decided.

The council also voted and approved the city to hire a total of 14 people, 7 high school students and 8 college students as lifeguards for the upcoming 2019 summer season, which is a total of two more than the previous

Also in new business, the council approved upcoming bids to be accepted for this years salt supply as well as opening bids for surplus in property, equipment and vehicles for the city. The city will have a total of seven vehicles to be sold at the Somerset auction. Equipment such as the 1999 Case Backhoe will sold by sealed bids as well as a property on Main Street via sealed bids.
