Russell County camped with LaRue, Taylor, and Washington counties this year. There were approximately 330 youth and adults that attended from all counties during this camp week.

The campers also had Jungle Games/Field Olympics this year along with a presentation by the Liberty Nature Center from Somerset. After evening recreation time, the 4-H campers had reflections and refreshments before returning to their cabins. During the afternoon, the campers attended one more class and had a time for swimming. Before dinner, the campers went to the flagpole to lower the American and 4-H flags.

Slaughter cows made up 9 percent of the offering, slaughter bulls 0 percent, replacement cows 1 percent, other cows 0 percent, and feeders 89 percent. The feeder supply included 46 percent steers, 47 percent heifers, and 7 percent bulls. Near 49 percent of the run weighed over 600 lbs.
