The financial report was read by Kim Fenske, County Treasurer and approved by the Court. The ending balances for June 30, 2019 were: Payroll \$0, General \$1,704,457.58, Road \$363,172.50, Jail LGEA \$517,261.15, \$5,156.00, **ASAP** \$107,723.76, Grants \$25,665.06, Tourism \$11,976.45, Dispatch \$112,668.08, Airport \$51,214.43, Airport \$95,699.98, Project \$12,101.21, Air-DFC port Board \$55,156.42, ABC \$44,018.65. The total of all funds was \$3,106,271.27.

The Fiscal Year to Date report July 1, 2018 -June 30, 2019 was also read by County Treasurer Kim Fenske. The Unencumbered Cash Balances were: Payroll \$0, General \$1,525,986.23, Road \$335, 870.67, Jail \$516,628.75, LGEA \$5,156, ASAP \$107,723.76, Grants \$25,665.06, **Tourism** \$11,976.45, Dispatch Airport \$112,688.08, \$51,105.67, Airport \$95,699.98, DFC \$12,101.21, Airport Board \$55,156.42, ABC \$43,379.05. The total of all funds was \$2,899,117.33.

Gray Tomblyn II, the Commissioner of Rural Roads and Municipal Aid addressed the court on the county's discretionary fund. Tomblyn relayed that Governor Bevin has approved \$313,539 for road reconstruction on the intersection of Hwy 910 and Hwy 76. Over the last twelve months that brings the total discretionary fund for the county to \$591,167.

A motion was made and approved to transfer \$25,000 from General to Tourism, \$46,153 from General to 911 Dispatch, \$538,015 from General to Jail, \$8,118 from General to LGEA, \$10,000 from ABC to 911 Dispatch, and \$15,000 from General to Airport.
