Community

rates fell in 107 Kentucky counties between November 2017 and November 2018, rose in nine, and stayed the same in four counties, according to the Kentucky Center for Statistics, an agency of the Kentucky Education and Workforce

For the first time since October 2000, Kentucky did not have any counties with an unemployment rate of 10 percent or above.

Woodford County recorded the lowest jobless rate in the Commonwealth at 2.5 percent. It was followed by Boone, Fayette, Oldham, Scott, Shelby and Spencer counties, 2.7 percent each; Campbell and Kenton counties, 2.8 percent each; and Anderson

Unemployment and Todd counties, 2.9 percent each.

State releases Nov. unemployment rates

Magoffin County recorded the state's highest unemployment rate at 9.9 percent. It was followed by Carter County, 6.7 percent; Lewis County, 6.2 percent; Elliott County, 6.1 percent; Wolfe County, 6 percent; Casey and Harlan counties, 5.9 percent each; Breathitt and Clay counties, 5.7 percent each; and Jackson, Lawrence, Leslie and Owsley counties, 5.6 percent each.

Kentucky's county unemployment rates and employment levels are not seasonally adjusted because of small sample sizes. Employment statistics undergo sharp fluctuations due to seasonal events such as weather changes, harvests, holidays and school

openings and closings. Seasonal adjustments eliminate these influences and make it easier to observe statistical trends. The comparable, unadjusted unemployment rate for the state was 3.5 percent for November 2018, and 3.5 percent for the nation.

Kentucky's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was released last week and can be viewed at https://bit.ly/2CDxr6d. In that release, Kentucky's statewide unemployment rate and employment levels are adjusted to observe statistical trends by removing seasonal influences such as weather changes, harvests, holidays and school openings and closings. Unemployment statistics are based on estimates and are compiled to measure trends rather than actually to count people working. Civilian labor force statistics include non-military workers and unemployed Kentuckians who are actively seeking work. They do not include unemployed Kentuckians who have not looked for employment within the past four weeks. The data should only be compared to the same month in previous years.

New Year brings in official doc. requests

The start of the new year typically means an increase in the number of requests for birth certificates and other official documents like marriage, divorce and death certificates. The Office of Vital Statistics, within the Cabinet for Health and Family Services (CHFS), processes those requests and is warning Kentuckians about purchasing documents online and paying additional fees to a third-party vendor not approved by the

Kentuckians can securely obtain Kentucky birth certificates or other official documents by placing an order through the Office of Vital Statistics in Frankfort; or by placing an order with VitalChek, an approved partner: https://www. vitalchek.com/.

VitalChek's processing fee of \$9.50 will apply for the use of a credit/debit card. Each

birth certificate is \$10, and each marriage, divorce, death or stillbirth certificate is \$6.

CHFS officials say while obtaining official documents is easy, it is important to be aware of the appropriate resources.

"Many unofficial third-party websites are claiming they can place an order for a birth certificate or provide customers with a birth certificate application," said Kentucky State Registrar Christina Stewart. "While their services may result in a birth certificate, the customer will have provided personal identifying information such as their address, phone number. credit card number or bank account number to an unofficial party. In addition, these types of websites are likely to charge much higher fees."





Certificates can also be processed by phone through VitalChek. Call VitalChek to order a certificate using a credit/debit card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover or American Express). For phone orders, VitalChek's processing fee is \$10.50. The VitalChek phone number is (800) 241-8322, choose option 1 to place an order.
