Shuffett wins fifth state title

Green County native Landon Shuffett finished 2018 on top in Kentucky pool.

Shuffett started playing pool as a five-year-old and started competing shortly after at the age of six. His skill has allowed him to travel and compete over seas in Austria, Germany and Nicaragua. Some of his favorite locations in the states he has played in include New York, Los Angeles, and Jacksonville, Fla.

Most recently, Shuffett won his fifth Kentucky State title in pool. The tournament was held Dec. 9 in Campbellsville at Rack & Cue, owned by David and Stephanie Whitlock.

During the previous week, Shuffett competed and placed as one of two finalists in St. Peters, Mo. at Teacher's Billiards in Jake Embry's Open 9-ball Tournament.

The other finalist in the 9-ball tournament, Justin Bergman, is currently ranked among the top in the country.

His schedule was packed in December, but tournament play his last five years has been limited.

Shuffett had turned his focus to college; he began his college education in 2013 in St. Charles, Mo.

Shuffett was able to take a break from competing because he has never looked at it as a job, but more for fun.

"Playing pool for me is not a job and has never been at any point since I began competing seriously," said Shuffett. "I don't consider it

a job now... more so just something I like to do because I enjoy it!"

Shuffett is still considered a young player, but the there are annual Junior National tournaments every year and those competitors are ages 18 and under.

Shuffett mentioned there are quite a few young players in this country aspiring to be great. The pool

world has continued to evolve.

The vast amount of accolades Shuffett is surrounded by with his pool career, he has branched out from playing to teaching.

With the number of younger players who have taken an interest and started learning techniques and the ropes of pool, Shuffett hopes to be a part of shaping the new players.

"To be quite honest, I don't have many goals in the game competitively," said Shuffett. "However, I would like to do more teaching in the St. Louis, Mo. area, most likely part-time, alongside of whatever other job I have at the time."

As he reflected on his career he shared details about his favorite tournament he has played in over the years.

"I always looked forward to more than most is the Derby City Classic that now takes place in Elizabeth, Ind.," said Shuffett. "This tournament is nine days long and there are three disciplines: bank pool, one pocket, and 9-ball."

Shuffett now resides in Missouri with his wife.

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KHEAA helps pay for higher education

Kentuckians seeking help to pay for college or technical training can take advantage of student aid programs administered by the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA). Those programs include the:

Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship. KEES lets high school students earn money by getting good grades in school and doing well on the ACT or SAT.

College Access Program Grant. CAP awards help financially needy students pay for classes at Kentucky's public and private two- and four-year colleges.

Kentucky Tuition Grant. Students enrolled full time in associate's and bachelor's degree programs at the state's private colleges may be eligible for a KTG award.

Dual Credit Scholarship. This scholarship is available to Ken-

tucky high school and home school students taking dual credit classes at a participating Kentucky college or university.

Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship. The WRKS helps Kentuckians who have not yet earned an associate's degree afford an industry recognized certificate or diploma.
