### Dragons move to 1-1 in District

It was a busy holiday season for the Dragons as they played in the annual Campbellsvile High School Holiday Classic Dec. 27-29.

They opened play December 27 against Elizabethtown, who finished 3-0 in the Holiday Classic. The final score was 52-85 in the Panthers' favor.

Gunner Bush led the team with 17 points and 8 rebounds. Senior Dennis Rose also scored in double-digits with 13 points and 5 rebounds.

Additional Dragons in the books included: Brody Bush-6 points and 6 rebounds. Braeden Sluder-4 points and 5 rebounds, Hunter McCubbins-4 points and 2 rebounds, Zyler Bardin-3 points and 3 rebounds, Kellen Whitlow-2 points and 4 rebounds, Bobby Landis-2 points and 3 rebounds, Keaton Perkins-1 point, and Bryce Blakeman-2 rebounds.

Round two was a back and forth game with Madison Southern around lunchtime December 28.

The lead changed a countless number of times before Madison Southern's threepoint shooting showed zero mercy on the Dragons. They hit a combined team total of 12 three-point baskets. The Eagles edged out a 75-63 win.

Gunner Bush was unstoppable underneath and finished with 22 points, five rebounds. Eighteen of the points were field goals from transition shots, put-backs and muscle. Brother Brody Bush also scored in double figures and led the team in rebounds with 10 points, 7 rebounds. #### Green Co. (57) vs. **LaRue Co. (72)** Jan. 4

The Dragons returned to the court for their first game of 2019 against the top Region 5 team. It was a tough loss against the LaRue County Hawks Friday in LaRue County. The Dragons move to a 1-1 district record.

Green County walked on the court prepared for battle and not intimidated by the Hawks' 11-2 record, one of the top teams in the state.

Threes rained down for the Dragons, the first time this season the team as a whole expanded their shooting range, and it paid off. At the end of the first quarter, the Dragons trailed by only a basket,

Bardin entered in the third quarter followed by a three pointer and a successful trip to the free throw line. Johnson picked up a steal and was fouled on the lay-up. With his free throw, the score was 39-62 at the end of the third.

Distefano switched out players and entered Bryce Blakeman and Kellen Whitlow. Whitlow came off the bench and scored back to back shots, a three pointer and a jump shot. The substitutes cut Hawk's lead to only 13 (70-57) and caused LaRue County's head coach to check-in his starters again. The Hawks only

scored one additional basket before the buzzer sounded.

Brody Bush led the team with a hard earned 14 points, 6 points from threepointers. The Hawks held him to only one rebound. Sluder and Gunner Bush each had 8 points, Rose-6, Johnson-5, Whitlow-5, Bardin-4, McCubbins-4, and Landis-3.

The Dragons pulled down 15 rebounds, McCubbins-4, Gunner Bush-3, Sluder-2, Rose-2, Johnson-1, Landis-1, and Blakeman-1.

The Dragons have continued to steadily improve and mesh as a team. They plan to improve their district season record.

Friday night the Dragons and Lady Dragons travel to Caverna for a boy/girl double header with their game starting at 7 p.m. and January 14 they travel to play the rescheduled Hart County game that was originally scheduled to be played Dec. 5. The game will also begin at
