"When forecasting, I use a website called pivotalweather,"Houksaid. "It has around 15 different computer simulated weather scenarios."

"I usually analyze the six main computer models and generate a general idea myself, which would be my forecast. Computers are always wrong, so I look at real time observations from the Kentucky Mesonet website, which is a chain of real time weather stations in Kentucky.'

"I take what I have learned through meteorology classes, and use past storms that I have experienced and generate a forecast," Houk


