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“When forecasting, I use a website called pivotal weather,” Houk said. “It has around 15 different computer simulated weather scenarios.”

“I usually analyze the six main computer models and generate a general idea myself, which would be my forecast. Computers are always wrong, so I look at real time observations from the Kentucky Mesonet website, which is a chain of real time weather stations in Kentucky.”

“I take what I have learned through meteorology classes, and use past storms that I have experienced and generate a forecast,” Houk said.

As a 2011 Green County High School graduate, Houk says he didn’t take the normal “college days” that most seniors do to visit potential schools.

He recalls missing a school trip to Western Kentucky University.

“I missed a college orientation trip to WKU my junior year due to the threat of tornadoes,” Houk said. “Later that day, my friends called me to ask about the weather... they were being moved to a tornado shelter due to a tornado warning.”

Vickie Houk recalls a similar incident. “We had been to Indiana one day and we stopped in E-town on the way home. He kept telling us to get home, a storm was coming. The sun was shining,” Vickie Houk said. “Five minutes later, a storm was here, black clouds and all.”

Peaking his ever-growing weather interest, Houk took a trip his senior year to WLKY with GCHS teachers Ms. JeNie Altman and Ms. Erin Bonta. They met Jay Cardosi, the four-time Emmy Award-winning meteorologist who leads WLKY’s Weather team.

Houk contributes GCHS English teacher JeNie Altman for always pushing him throughout high school and even beyond graduation.

“Corey always loved the weather and would get excited at school, any time we had a storm brewing,” Altman said. “Through a friend, Rick VanHoose, I made arrangements for him to meet Jay Cardosi. Corey was so excited and in his element.”

“When we got back, I ‘nudged’ him to apply to college,” Altman said “He hadn’t really

thought he would, but this trip changed his mind.”

Still pushing Houk to be his best, Altman keeps in touch with her former student.

“I’m so proud of the young man he has become and look forward to watching his career continue to grow.”

Houk obtained his Associate’s Degree from Elizabethtown Community and Technical College in 2013. He then pursued his meteorology degree at Western Kentucky University.

“I was really starting to learn how to forecast the weather, and I started to become more active on social media,” Houk said.

“I quickly figured out that Green County was a dead zone for media coverage. I took it upon myself to start giving detailed weather forecasts, especially during active weather situations.”

The meteorology job market is much smaller than one would think, with most careers having to relocate to larger cities within Kentucky or out of state. And the market is very competitive.

Aside from college, Houk had no interest in leaving his hometown.

In 2015 Houk took a break from his degree.

“I had several talks with God, friends, and family,” Houk said. “I decided to take a break and weigh my options.”

He moved back to Greensburg and fulfilled the other part of his dream: he met a girl, fell in love, got married, and bought a house... over the span two years.

As 2017 progressed, Houk, a weatherstar online, had a full-time job – social media weather, albeit non-paying.

Unsure of his meteorology future, in April 2018 Houk received a call from local radio station Q104’s Rob Collins. Collins offered him a position of weather broadcasting. He accepted.

“It was all coming together for me,” Houk said. “God closed one door, where he could open another for me.”

Currently, Houk is working to finish his meteorology degree online.

While his ideal four-year college plan didn’t pan out, Houk doesn’t mind.

“Each person is different, and God has a different plan for everyone. His plan was to keep me close to home, doing what I love,” he said. “God knew Green County needed their own personal weatherman.”

Houk is the son of Larry and Vickie Houk, the brother of Laura Beth. Corey and his wife Katelynn reside in Greensburg with their 2-month-old son, Lander.

“There’s no place I would rather raise our new baby boy, than right here in Green County.”

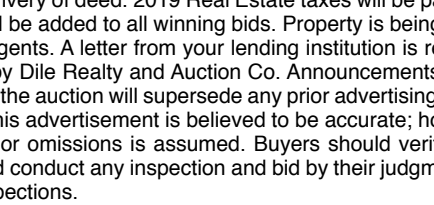
