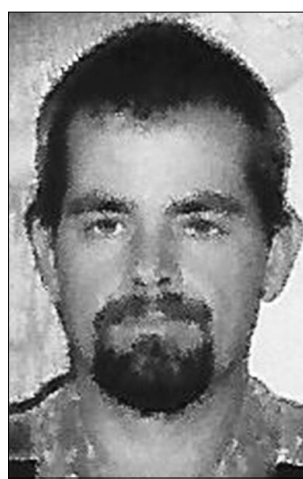


James Kevin Polston, 50

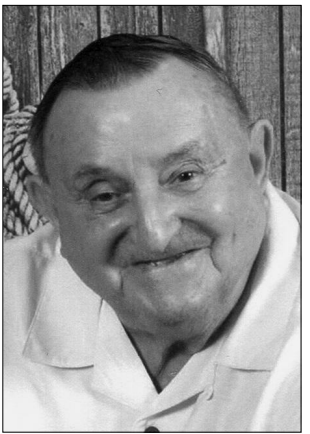
Herbert Earl Rock, 85
